## **American Fork City Council Announces PARC Tax Recipients for 2016**

**Fitness Center, Timpanogos Arts Foundation and Art Dye Park among big grants**

AMERICAN FORK, UTAH – In November 2014, residents voted in favor of a 1/10 of 1 percent sales tax increase, called the Park, Arts, Recreation and Culture (“PARC”) tax. The intent of the PARC tax is to help fund quality-of-life programs and facilities without putting an undue burden on residents, but rather by spreading it out among patrons of American Fork retail establishments.

On June 28, American Fork PARC Board recommended, and received City Council approval to award grants to the following qualifying organizations:
